After discussion, the plan is to order 80-page yearbooks, which allows space for 2 pages per classroom, pages for activities and pages where parents can opt to purchase extra space to highlight their child (write a special note, have relatives write messages, post baby pictures for 5th graders, etc.). These extra ads will buy down the over-all price of the year books, as well as add something special for those who choose to use it. 6. **School Report-**Janet Prats: In-district transfer process changed last year so that now the time to apply is March 1-31st. Sumpter usually does not approve transfers because our classroom size is already quite full. Exceptions are made for students who move half-way through the year and want to finish the year at Sumpter. Kindergarten registration began Feb 21st. Please enroll your kinders asap. Our staffing budget is dependent on the estimated number of students who will be enrolled in September—but the district budgets money for staffing in the spring.

PE teacher has been researching pricing for gym renovations including a ceiling-mounted projector and cage to be used for the entire school. After discussion PTC would like to raise \$15,000 to be dedicated to a Gym Renovation Project, as there are quite a few items that need updating.

Doing a paddle raise at the auction and sock hop specifically for this project was discussed.

7. **Upcoming events:**

Auction Update-Rene Tyson: Thursday the 9th is the last day to purchase tickets. 85 tickets have been sold, our goal was to have 100 attendees so there is still time! If 2 people want to each buy one table (seats 8) then the job would be done!
